"The true purpose of education is to produce citizens. It is not only in the courses bearing directly on history and government that citizenship can be taught. The child taking Latin and mathematics is also learning invaluable lessons in citizenship. The power of concentration and accuracy which these students develop will later mean a man or woman able to understand and analyze a difficult situation. The other school contacts - social activities and athletics - develop team play, cooperation and thought, and consideration for others." - Eleanor Roosevelt


